2011 Season

The 2011 season was a good one although not quite as successful as last year. From 48 fixtures we won 21, drew 1, abandoned 7, 6 games were cancelled and lost 13. As a result, we had a 63% success rate with those finished. Whilst not as good as 2010 we should still be pleased.



We generally had strength in our batting which gave our skippers the confidence to bat first whenever we won the toss. The tactics generally worked very well with very few opposing sides being able to chase down what was usually a healthy score. Certainly earlier in the season we had a very good win/loss percentage. Over the middle of the summer and towards the back end of the season the opposition proved more challenging.

THE 2011 AWARD WINNERS

Most Runs: P. Kumar (965)

Prash was our most involved player, playing 36 matches. In addition to a prolific batting performance he often took the gloves on a Sunday and also had a go at leg spin taking 20 wickets.

Highest Innings: P. Kumar (140 not out)

This is an innings that Prash will remember for a long time. Not one chance was on offer which reflects immense concentration and stamina.

Best Batting Average: Nigel Field (63.67)

For the second year in a row Nigel has taken the batting average. This reflects his ability to stay concentrated no matter what is going on around him.

Bowling, Most Wickets: Ali (38)

Ali is our regular opening bowler and, with 32 matches, also one of our most involved players. He bowled some very good deliveries and is on the upward momentum.

Best Bowling in a Match: Derrick Randall (6 for 25)

Del is our Sunday skipper and most senior player. He used to open the batting (see the Duck Cup) but has found a new lease of life with the ball.

Best Bowling Average: Derrick Randall (12.33)

With 33 wickets, Del was not far off completing the bowling treble.

Best Young Player: Will Voaden

Will joined us this year and made an impact with both the bat and the ball.

Most Improved Player: Armando Borges

Armando puts in a tremendous effort on the field, epitomised in his last game of the season. Fielding at fine leg he dived full stretch for a catch, missing the catch but saving two runs. An X-ray the following day revealed a broken finger!

Best Fielder: Zeeshan

Zeeshan is consistently our most effective fielder, often hitting the stumps from the out-field.
